## NFC director denies credit card abuse

**ONGOING PROBE:** Only company expenses charged

## KUALA LUMPUR

ATIONAL Feedlot Corporation (NFC) executive director Wan Shahinur Izran Salleh has denied allegations that he and other family members had abused the corporation's credit card for individual reasons.

Shahinur tweeted that the credit card was used for company expenses.

He said the opposition had made defamatory statements to gain political mileage.

He also tweeted that NFC would cooperate in any investigation pertaining to it and that many police reports had been lodged by NFC employees over alleged threats and attempts made by certain parties to intimidate them.

Meanwhile, **Bernama** reports that the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) is looking into various aspects in

connection with the alleged misappropriation of funds by NFC.

Director of investigations Datuk Mustafar Ali said a thorough and transparent investigation would be carried out before a report is submitted to the Attorney-General's Chambers.

"I cannot comment further on this issue to avoid disrupting the ongoing investigation," he said yesterday.

The assets of NFC have been temporarily frozen to facilitate investigations by MACC and police.

Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Shahrizat Abdul Jalil has taken three-week leave from her ministerial duties pending the outcome of the investigations as her husband, Datuk Seri Dr Mohamed Salleh Ismail, is executive chairman of NFC and their children are directors of the company.
