## Shahrizat wants comprehensive NFCorp probe

**PUTRAJAYA:** Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Shahrizat Abdul Jalil says no stone should be left unturned in the investigations into the National Feedlot

Corporation (NFCorp) controversy.

Shahrizat, who is linked to the issue through her husband, NFCorp executive chairman Datuk Seri Dr Mohamed Salleh Ismail, said she was quizzed by the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission as to whether there was a conflict of interest in the decision-making process.

"I made it known that there wasn't. There are official papers to confirm this," she said after a 2<sup>1/2</sup>-hour meeting with the MACC at its head-

quarters here yesterday.

Shahrizat, who was unaccompanied, was met by MACC investigations director Datuk

Mustafar Ali around 4pm.

The Wanita Umno chief, who had just returned from a three-week leave, said she had willingly come forward to be questioned and investigated.

Apart from Shahrizat's husband, her chil-

dren are also directors of NFCorp.

On why she did not come forward earlier, Shahrizat said she was waiting for her turn, in line with MACC's procedures.

"I want no stone left unturned, as I've been

subjected to a lot of wild allegations."
