BOGOR Agricultural University or Institut Pertanian Bogor (IPB), a dynamic institution established in 1963, is located in the western border of Bogor City about 60km from Jakarta. IPB is growing in recognition as one of the best universities by subject rank area. holding the 84th position in the OS Asian University Rankings 2011. Its Faculty of Veterinary Medicine is recognised by the Malaysian Public Services Department


(PSD) and Malaysian Veterinary Council. The emphasis on research to meet international standards and the development of exceptional research principles has positioned IPB as one of the excellent universities in Indonesia and

Besides veterinary medicine, IPB's degree in Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry are also

recognised by PSD.

IPB's Veterinary Medicine programme covers anatomy, physiology, reproduction, pathology and pharmacology. It also gives exposure to areas such as the science of animal diseases, veterinary public health and clinical site. IPB is the only veterinary school in Indonesia to use horses in topographic and surgical anatomy. It has a teaching animalhospital, which is the most outstanding animal hospital in South-east Asia, Furthermore, IPB has high quality facilities and initiatives for students to undergo practical sessions with 385 physical laboratories and 12 experiment stations situated in various campuses around Bogor. The library in IPB, equipped with an electronic library, is acknowledged to be among the biggest libraries in Indonesia. In addition, there is a student cyber centre equipped with 800 computers, optical fibre network systems, and there are also hot-spots for internet access at several campus locations. The Language Training Unit and



Integrated Laboratory Units are provided for students to carry out their clinical practices and research activities.

The specific research facilities are managed by 13 centres for research and community services that provide research in support of resource development and conservation in both terrestrial and aquatic environments.

Graduates are not limited to becoming veterinarians or researchers only but may also be a part of a team of entrepreneurs in the field of agro-livestock or animal medicine.

Likewise, they could also join the police or the Forensic Science Unit.
