## Chronology of NFCorp scandal

- Oct 27, 2007: NFCorp is awarded the feedlot project
- Dec 6, 2007: NFCorp signs RM250 million government soft loan agreement to start the feedlot in Gemas, Negri Sembilan
- Oct 25, 2011: Auditor-General's Report reveals that NFCorp failed to hit its target of breeding 8,000 cattle by 2010.
- Nov 8: PKR claims RM81.22 million was siphoned off to associated companies owned by Datuk Seri Shahrizat Abdul Jalil's family
- Nov 10: PKR alleges NFCorp paid RM10 million for condominiums in Bangsar belonging to National Meat and Livestock Corporation Sdn Bhd
- Nov 14: Sabah Umno MP Datuk Bung Mokhtar Radin calls on Shahrizat to resign
- Nov 17: Shahrizat's husband and NFCorp executive chairman Datuk Seri Dr Mohamad Salleh Ismail says two condominiums purchased at RM6.9 million as investments for the project

- Nov 30: PKR claims NFCorp used RM5 million to buy Mercedes Benz and land in Putrajaya and channelled RM588,585 cash to companies owned by Shahrizat's family
- Dec 9: Former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad urges Shahrizat to resign
- Dec 20: PKR alleges another RM10 million was used to buy luxury condominium in Singapore
- Jan 12: Shahrizat goes on three weeks leave from ministerial duties
- Jan 14: PM Najib announces that NFCorp's assets have been frozen pending investigations
- ► Feb 8: PKR alleges Shahrizat's family used part of the RM250 million to purchase two RM17 million condominiums
- Feb 8: Shahrizat returns to work
- March 7: PKR alleges Shahrizat's family has used the loan to finance eight office units in KL Eco City worth RM12 million
- March 11: Shahrizat announces resignation as women, family and community development minister
- March 12: NFCorp executive chairman Mohamad Salleh charged in court
