REGULATIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF DUCKLINGS FROM SINGAPORE INTO MALAYSIA

- A. Bird : Ducklings
- B. Country of Export : Singapore
- C. Purpose : Commercial Broiler
- D. Regulations for importation:

1. Import Licence

The consignment of ducklings shall be accompanied by a valid import licence issued by the Director General of Veterinary Services, Malaysia or the State Director concerned permitting the importation of such ducklings into State(s) of Malaysia.

2. Description of Ducklings

The consignment of ducklings shall be accompanied by a certificate containing a full description or identification of the ducklings.

3. Veterinary Certification

The consignment of duckling shall be accompanied by a veterinary health certificate issued by a competent Veterinary officer of Singapore certifying that:

- 3.1 the ducklings are bona fide Singapore ducklings.
- 3.2 Singapore is free from fowl plague and duck plague (Duck Viral Enteritis) for 12 months preceding the export of the duckling,
- 3.3 farm/farms of origin in Singapore has/have been free of Duck Viral Hepatitis for the preceding 12 months of export, 3.4 the ducklings were hatched from eggs from and accredited pullorum free farm in Singapore,
- 3.5 the ducklings were derived from eggs hatched in incubator which has been disinfected or fumigated prior to hatch,
- 3.6 that the ducklings were packed direct from the incubator into satisfactory clean boxes for export and had no contact with any birds other than day-old duckling,
- 3.7 the ducks and their flock of origin have been inspected on the premises of origin by the competent Veterinary Officer (PPD) and found free from evidence of any infectious and contagious disease, immediately prior to export.

4. The farm and hatchery shall be subjected to inspection by the

Department of Veterinary Services, Malaysia, as and when necessary.
