'She's cooperating with MACC'

Shahrizat said she had gone on leave with the hope that MACC would call her but it only contacted her on Tuesday.

The controversy surrounding NF-Corp started after the Auditor-General's 2010 Report pointed out there were weaknesses in the implementation of the National Feedlot Centre project.

In December 2007, the government

approved a soft loan of RM250 million, with an annual interest of two per cent for 10 years, for NFCorp to start a national feedlot centre in Gemas, Negri Sembilan, to help reduce beef imports. The initial target was to produce 60,000 heads of cattle a year.

The corporation's assets has since been frozen, while Shahrizat has filed a RM100 million suit against Parti Keadilan Rakyat strategic director Mohd Rafizi Ramli and Ampang member of parliament Zuraida Kamaruddin

over their allegations.

Rafizi had alleged Shahrizat's family owned two more luxury condominiums in Singapore worth RM34.6 million, with bank loans obtained from leveraging on the fixed deposit accounts containing part of the RM250 million loan.

Mustafar said Shahrizat had been cooperative during the investigation.

"Calling Datuk Shahrizat is part of the investigations. Our officers have recorded her statement."
