

Cops re-submit NFC probe papers

KUALA LUMPUR: The investigation papers on the National Feedlot Corporation (NFC) scandal were re-submitted to the Attorney-General's Chambers last week for further action, according to the police yesterday.

Federal police commercial crime investigations department director Commissioner Datuk Syed Ismail Syed Azizan said police have completed the probe and are discussing the

case with the AG's Chambers.

"We are waiting for orders from the AG's Chambers on the next course of action," he told *theSun* when contacted yesterday

Police concluded their probe into the case three weeks ago and had submitted their papers to the AG's Chambers but they were returned to the investigators days later for them to beef up the findings.

About 60 people including NFC officials had their statements recorded in the

course of the probe which began in December last year.

The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission, which is carrying out its own probe into the NFC for misappropriation of funds, was quoted as saying its investigations were almost completed.

The NFC landed itself in hot soup after findings in the Auditor-General's Report 2011 showed discrepancies in the management of the company.
