In need of good home

Puppies ready to be adopted

MONA, Monet, Melvin, Harvey, Morgan and Magnolia are among 12 puppies that were dumped at Second Chance's shelter last month.

They were left in a box that was sealed up for hours before volunteers took notice.

They have settled down at the shelter after much initial confusion and fear. They have been dewormed, vaccinated and now ready to go to loving homes.

"It's shocking how people can be so irresponsible. The pups could have suffocated to death.

"We urgently need to find them good homes. Our shelter is way too overcrowded with more than 180 dogs and pups," said Second Chance coordinator Tracy Ho.

Second Chance will hold an adoption drive at its temporary shelter at 3 ½ mile at Old Klang Road, behind Wisma Buddhist, on June 3 (Sunday) from 10am to 6pm.

Second Chance was formerly known as Paws Mission, set up in 2009. Ho said the group has been renamed to better reflect its core principle of helping strays find a new lease of life.

Second Chance appealed to all dog and cat owners to be responsible and neuter their pets.

"We do our best to place our dogs in loving homes but the sad fact is, the number of homeless animals far exceeds the number of willing adopters," Ho said.

Second Chance's current shelter will be demolished soon for development.

Ho said the group plans to rent a one-acre piece of land in Hulu Langat and is urgently raising RM100,000 to build a new shelter for its animals.

"We rely solely on public donation. Please help us to give these homeless animals a second chance," she said.
