## **REGULATIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF PORK AND PORK PRODUCTS FROM CANADA INTO MALAYSIA**

**A. Products** : Pork and Pork Products

**B. Country of Export** : Canada

**C. Purpose** : Human Consumption

**D. Regulations for Importation: -**

### **1. Import Permit**

Each consignment of pork and pork products shall be accompanied by a valid import permit issued by the Malaysian Quarantine and Inspection Services, Malaysia (MAQIS) permitting the importation of pork and pork products into Malaysia.

### **2. Veterinary Health Certification**

The consignment of pork or pork products shall be accompanied by a veterinary health certificate issued by a competent Veterinary Authority of the exporting country within seven (7) days of export certifying that ;

- 2.1. The country or part of the country or state of origin has been free from foot and mouth disease (FMD), anthrax, african swine fever, classical swine fever (hog cholera), swine vesicular disease and enterovirus encephalomyelitis for the past twelve (12) months prior to and till the date of export.
- 2.2. The farms (from which the pigs were derived) have been certified to be free from porcine respiratory and reproductive syndrome (PRRS), transmissible gastroenteritis, aujeszky's disease, vesicular stomatitis, atropic rhinitis of swine, leptospirosis, porcine brucellosis and no case of infectious or contagious pig diseases have occurred or been diagnosed at the farm in the preceding six (6) months prior to export.
- 2.3. The pigs (from which the products were derived) have been continuously resident from birth in the farm (the name and address of the farm shall be clearly stated in the certificate) under continuous supervision of the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country.
- 2.4. The pigs (from which the products were derived) have been slaughtered and processed in an abattoir (the name, address and establishment number of the abattoir must be clearly stated in the certificate) which has been approved for export by the DVS, Malaysia and has been under continuous supervision of the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country.
- 2.5. The pork or pork products were derived from pigs that had been subjected to ante-mortem and post-mortem inspection and were found to be healthy and free from any clinical sign of infectious or contagious disease at the time of slaughtering / processing.
- 2.6. The pork or pork products have been processed, packed and stored under sanitary condition and do not contain any preservatives, colouring matter, residue or any foreign substance or harmful material injurious to health and that every precaution has been taken to prevent contamination during processing, packing, storing and handling prior to export.
- 2.7. The pork or pork products destined for export to Malaysia are safe, wholesome and fit for human consumption.

### **3. Transportation and Landing Place**

- 3.1. The vehicle / container used for the transportation of frozen or chilled pork or pork products must be in hygienic conditions and refrigerated.
- 3.2. Each consignment of pork or pork products imported into Malaysia shall be carried by ship or aircraft or any vehicle direct to the prescribed landing place or any other port or airport in Malaysia.

### **4. Inspection at the Point of Entry in Malaysia**

- 4.1. All official documents required under this importation shall be surrendered for verification to the Director General or the State Director of Veterinary Services Malaysia or to any authorised officer of DVS, Malaysia or MAQIS on arrival at designated port or airport in Malaysia.
- 4.2. Each consignment of pork meat or pork products imported into Malaysia shall be subjected to veterinary inspection by the authorised officer of the DVS, Malaysia or MAQIS. Random samples will then be collected for laboratory testing and DVS, Malaysia has the right to reject, destroy or further detain any consignment when deemed necessary.

### **5. Other Conditions**

- 5.1. The Department of Veterinary Services, Malaysia has the right to enquire for any document or detailed information from the parties concerned. In the event that applicants (importers or exporters) fail or unable to provide or to comply with any of the above requirement, the DVS has the right to reject or not to approve the application.
- 5.2. All costs incurred for inspection of the abattoir by the official(s) from the DVS, Malaysia prior to approval shall be borne by the parties concerned.

### **6. Suspension of Import**

The Director General of Veterinary Services or the State Director of Veterinary Services Malaysia may at any time when deemed necessary suspend the importation of the products either temporarily or permanently in the event of disease outbreaks or suspected disease outbreaks or in case of importation in contravention of the above regulations.

### **7. Right to Amend Import Regulations**

The Director General of Veterinary Services Malaysia reserves the right to amend the above regulations at any time as he may deem necessary.
