Hanya untung 10 sen setiap kilogram

Kuala Terengganu: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna (KPDNHEP) Terengganu mengenal pasti beberapa pemberong ayam bersikap cekik darah di negeri ini.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Keusahawanan, Sumber Manusia, Industri Mikro dan Hal Ehwal Penjaja negeri, Mohd Nurkhuzaini Ab Rahman berkata, sikap buruk pemberong ayam menjual melebihi harga ditetapkan kepada peniaga runcit adalah satu penganiayaan.

Katanya, peniaga merungut hanya memperoleh keuntungan 10 sen bagi setiap kilogram (kg) ayam standard selepas kerajaan menguatkuasakan Skim Harga Maksimum Musim Perayaan (SHMMP) Hari Raya Puasa 2021.

"Peniaga mengadu pemberong menjual ayam ke-

pada mereka dengan harga RM7.80 satu kg sedangkan harga borong ditetapkan adalah RM7.10 kg.

"Akibat itu, peniaga pula menghadapi keperitan apabila terpaksa menjual

harga ayam RM7.90 satu kg bagi mematuhi syarat kerajaan dan mereka hanya memperoleh keuntungan 10 sen setiap kg," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian kepada

media selepas melakukan tinjauan pematuhan SHMMP di Pasar Besar Kedai Payang di sini, semalam.

Turut hadir, Pengarah KPDNHEP negeri, Saharuddin Mohd Kia.

Mohd Nurkhuzaini yang juga Ahli Dewan Undangan negeri (Adun) Kota Putera berkata, KPDNHEP negeri sudah diarahkan mengambil tindakan ke atas pemberong ayam yang didapati mengikari harga borong.

"Kita dimaklumkan KPDNHEP sudah melakukan risikan dan mengenal pasti nama pemberong yang bersikap keterlaluan melakukan penindasan.

"Hasil tinjauan dilakukan mendapati bukan sahaja peniaga runcit ayam ditindas, malah peniaga ikan turut menerima tempias dan menjadi mangsa penindasan pemberong," katanya.

Keeping it fresh with innovation

Quality foremost for homegrown brand offering dairy and plant-based milk products

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WALK into any supermarket or store and a variety of milk products awaits consumers.

While shelves are mostly filled with cow's milk, products like goat's milk and plant-based milks have become popular as well.

And among these offerings are homegrown brand Farm Fresh's dairy and plant-based milk products that cater to different preferences in terms of taste and dietary requirements.

According to Loi Tuan Ee, who is founder and managing director of The Holstein Milk Company Sdn Bhd (HMC) and Farm Fresh Milk Sdn Bhd, Farm Fresh offers more than 80 SKU (stock keeping unit) consisting of fresh milk, flavoured milk and yogurt-based products as well as goat's milk.

Loi started his fresh milk business in 2010 after investing RM110mil in his farm at Mawai in Kota Tinggi, Johor. Sixty Holstein Jersey cows were imported from Australia for the purpose.

The 58-year-old believes few Malaysian consumers are aware that around 90% of products on retail shelves are made from powdered milk.

"Mothers can give their children fresh milk if it is sugar-free," he said at his farm Ladang 16, Taman Pertanian Universiti, Universiti Putra Malaysia in Serdang, Selangor.

Today, Loi has 6,000 cows, including tropical cows, and 250 goats in Malaysia, while there are another 2,500 Holstein cows in a farm in Australia.

Besides the Serdang farm – a collaboration with UPM that has

earned the Industry Centre of Excellence recognition. Farm Fresh's other farms are in Bandar Muadzam Shah (Pahang), Desaru (Johor), Pondok Tanjung in Taiping (Perak) and in Australia.

For Loi, the quality of feed is very important in ensuring that the cows, which he refers to as "girls and ladies", are well nourished.

He said this was why Farm Fresh planted Napier grass, which was high in protein and energy, and

Mombasa grass at its farms.

The company's senior farm manager Jacob Mathan added, "We treat our cows as guests at a five-star hotel and nourish them with the best feed available."

"We grow a lot of fresh grass for them and harvest at peak ripeness."

"Together with the grass, we also feed the cows corn and soya beans as well as other vitamins and minerals to ensure the right nutritional

balance," he said.

Farm Fresh milk products are available in two versions – pasteurised and UHT (ultra-high temperature).

"The company has grown to become a No.1 brand in the fresh milk category, based on the AC Nielsen report for 2019," Loi noted.

He said Farm Fresh also wanted to provide business opportunities to others through its home dealers

networking system that was initiated in 2016 – the brainchild of HMC and Farm Fresh chief operating officer Azmi Zainal.

"Many home dealers and agents have become part of our value chain in terms of distribution (of dairy products).

"Some home dealers can earn up to RM5,000 a month by just distributing our products to night markets, neighbourhood stalls, schools and directly to consumers."

"We want to make a positive impact on communities and be socially responsible in terms of environment," Loi added.

Azmi said Farm Fresh currently has 38 stockists, 876 home dealers and 1,586 agents under its home dealers system, which has increased the company's market base and enabled it to reach out to rural consumers nationwide.

The system, he noted, has uplifted the economic status of its stockists, and helped home dealers and agents enjoy better earnings.

Azmi also said that Farm Fresh would be launching a new banana-flavoured milk in June to cater to local taste buds.

He said the Kurma Milk (date-flavoured milk) that was launched in 2016, turned out to a hit, especially during Ramadan.

"We have launched our vegan series – almond milk, soy milk and oat milk – this year due to the increasing trend for plant-based products in the market."

"We also launched an Australian organic milk in March, and the response is encouraging."

"Our products are made from fresh milk so the nutritious (value), taste and aroma is different," he added.

Tembak guna pelali sebelum curi lembu

Dua suspek ditahan masing-masing miliki rekod jenayah lampau

Polis menumpaskan geng curi lembu dengan menahan dua lelaki di kawasan semak di Kampung Kemudu Bongkok, Permata Macang di sini pada Selasa.

Geng berkenaan dipercayai menggunakan modus operandi membak haiwan berkenaan dengan ubat pelali sebelum ‘menyumbatnya’ ke dalam lori.

Ketika ditahan, turut ditemui ialah tujuh lembu termasuk yang sudah mati dipercayai dicuri oleh suspek berusia 37 dan 46 tahun.

Pemangku Ketua Polis Daerah Bachok, Asisten Superintendant Mohd Yusrizal Mohd Ghazali ber-

kata, polis menerima laporan berhubung kes kecurian 17 ekor lembu di kawasan Jelawat, Telong, Melawi dan Tawang membabitkan kerugian RM35,000.

Bertindak atas laporan pada awal bulan Mac itu, pasukan anggota Bahagian Siasatan Jenayah Daerah (BSJD) Bachok melancarkan operasi khas pada jam 9 malam Selasa.

“Hasil risikan dan maklumat daripada orang awam, polis menyerbu kawasan semak di Kampung Kemudu Bongkok, Permata Machang, Bachok dan berjaya menangkap dua lelaki berkenaan,” katanya dalam satu kenyataan pada Ahad.

Beliau berkata, suspek menembak lembu berkenaan untuk mengelakkannya terbabit bertindak liar.

“Semakan mendapati suspek

pertama memiliki rekod lampau berkaitan kes jenayah dan dadah, bagaimanapun ujian urinnya negatif dadah.

“Suspek kedua pula memiliki rekod lampau berkaitan lima kes dadah dan satu kes jenayah, manakala ujian urinnya didapati positif methamphetamine,” katanya.

Tambah beliau, siasatan awal mendapati geng berkenaan aktif menjalankan kegiatan mencuri lembu di daerah Bachok, Pasir Puteh dan Besut, Terengganu.

“Polis masih lagi mengesan rakan sejenayah suspek yang masih bebas,” katanya.

Beliau berkata, dua yang ditahan itu dikenakan perintah reman selama tujuh hari bagi membantu siasatan mengikut Seksyen 379 Kanun Keseksaan kerana mencuri.

African Swine Fever in eight Sabah districts

KOTA KINABALU: African Swine Fever (ASF) outbreaks have been declared in eight districts in Sabah — Pitas, Beluran, Kinabatangan, Lahad Datu, Kota Marudu, Sandakan, Telupid and Tongod, said Deputy Chief Minister Datuk Seri Dr Jeffrey Kitingan. Kitingan, who is also state agriculture and fisheries minister, said ASF, which affects pigs and wild boar, was also detected in Tawau and Nabawan districts. He said up to April 18, 398 pigs had been culled and 535 had died of the fever. “The authorities have conducted 234 awareness campaigns in 14 districts, not only to educate the public about the disease, but also to highlight the government’s efforts to prevent it from spreading. Though Sandakan has an ASF outbreak, the disease has not spread to the district’s main pork production farms.” Bernama

Editorial

Peniaga daging mahu harga dikaji semula

Arau: Kekurangan lembu tempatan dan kebergantungan kepada lembu import mungkin menyebabkan peniaga daging di Perlis tetap mahukan harga daging dalam Skim Harga Maksimum Musim Perayaan Hari Raya Puasa (SHMMP) 2021, dikaji semula.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Perumahan dan Kerajaan Tempatan, Penjaja dan Peniaga Kecil, Perdagangan Dalam Negeri, Koperasi dan Kepenggunaan, Pembangunan Usahawan dan Industri Kecil dan Sederhana negeri, Azizan Sulaiman, berkata walaupun tiada laporan rasmi mengenai perkara itu di Perlis, pihaknya tetap memantau perkembangan berkenaan.

"Saya melihat ada rungutan dan gesaan supaya harga RM34 untuk daging segar yang ditetapkan dalam SHMMP dikaji semula, namun kita di pihak kerajaan negeri masih belum merumus laporan rasmi mengenai perkara berkenaan.

"Saya tidak menolak kemungkinan kekurangan lembu tempatan serta kebergantungan kepada lembu import, terutama dari Thailand menyebabkan harga daging segar dikatakan meningkat naik bagi musim perayaan ini," katanya selepas merasmikan program Kempen Hargai Ma-

kanan Elakkan Pembaziran di Bazar Ramadan Arau, di sini, semalam.

Dalam perkembangan lain, beliau berkata, tiada sebarang kenaikan harga minyak masak bersubsidi dikesan di Perlis seperti didakwa sesetengah pihak.

"Harga minyak masak, terutama satu kilogram masih kekal RM2.50, harga minyak masak botol juga kekal mengikut jumlah

berat isi padu yang dibotolkan. Diharapkan semua pihak dapat mematuhi SHMMP 2021 dan tidak sesuka hati menaikkan harga barang ditetapkan," kata dia.

Terdahulu ketika berucap pada majlis berkenaan, Azizan berkata, kajian Perbadanan Pengurusan Sisa Pepejal dan Pembersihan Awam (SWCorp) mendapati, sisanya makanan yang dilupuskan di

tapak pelupusan sampah seluruh Malaysia adalah sekitar 44.5 peratus atau bersamaan 17,000 tan sehari.

"Jumlah itu boleh memberi makan 3 juta orang sehari dengan tiga kali hidangan daripada sarapan, makan tengah hari dan makan malam. Di Perlis sahaja, sisanya makanan direkodkan sehari adalah 35.9 peratus atau 52.5 tan di mana ia boleh memberi makan 1,300 orang dengan tiga kali hidangan.

"Pembaziran ini lazimnya pada Ramadan terutama di bazar Ramadan, hotel serta restoran yang menganjurkan buffet berbuka puasa di mana sisanya makanan yang tidak habis akan dibuang sahaja selepas itu," katanya.

Terdahulu, Azizan bersama Pengarah SWCorp Negeri Perlis, Shamsuharizal Basir bersama-sama meninjau perjalanan operasi peniaga Bazar Ramadan Arau di samping memberi peringatan dan gesaan untuk mengelakkan pembaziran makanan serta mengurangkan penggunaan beg plastik dalam kalangan peniaga.

Pengunjung bazar Ramadan di galak membawa mangkuk tingkat dalam dalam usaha mengelakkan pembaziran serta penggunaan beg plastik.
