Siasat kenaikan harga makanan ternakan

Kuala Terengganu: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna (KPDNHEP) Terengganu akan menjalankan siasatan segera berhubung isu kenaikan harga makanan ternakan di pasaran.

Pengarah KPDNHEP Terengganu Saharuddin Mohd Kia berkata, pihaknya sedia maklum dengan kenaikan harga makanan ternakan di pasaran akhir-akhir ini.

"Bagaimanapun, tiada laporan secara rasmi yang diperoleh daripada penternak atau pengguna mengenainya sehingga sekarang.

"Bagaimanapun, kami akan membuat pemantauan harga makanan ternakan di pasaran.

"Sekiranya berlaku kenaikan harga yang tidak munasabah dan mempunyai unsur pencatutan, tindakan boleh diambil," katanya ketika dihubungi, semalam.

Produk bernilai lebih RM111,000 itu dibawa masuk dari Belgium

Jabatan Perkhidmatan Kuarantin dan Pemeriksaan Malaysia (Maqis) berjaya mematahkan cubaan membawa masuk produk babi sejuk beku seberat 21,190.64 kilogram yang dianggarkan bernilai RM111,626.41 dari Belgium pada Rabu.

Pengarah Maqis Johor, Hizuan Hasim berkata, penguat

kuasa menahan sebuah kontena yang membawa produk itu pada jam 10.15 pagi melalui pemeriksaan rutin di Pelabuhan Tanjung Pelepas.

Menurutnya, pemeriksaan lanjut mendapati pengisytiharan yang dilakukan mengelirukan pihak berkuasa iaitu alamat pengimport pada permit Maqis dan borang K1 berbeza dengan alamat pada Sijil Kesihatan Veterinar yang telah diikrarkan.

"Maqis bertindak merampas kesemua produk babi sejuk beku itu untuk tindakan lanjut," katanya dalam satu kenyataan pada Jumaat.

Jelasnya, kes tersebut akan disiasat di bawah Seksyen 13 Akta Perkhidmatan Kuarantin

dan Pemeriksaan Malaysia 2011 [Akta 728] kerana melakukan pengisytiharan yang mengelirukan pihak berkuasa.

Jika sabit kesalahan, boleh didenda tidak melebihi RM50,000 atau dipenjara selama tempoh tidak melebihi dua tahun atau kedua-duanya dan bagi kesalahan kedua atau yang berikutnya didenda tidak melebihi RM75,000 atau dipenjarakan selama tempoh tidak melebihi lima tahun atau kedua-duanya.

"Maqis menasihatkan semua pengimport dan pengeksport sentiasa mengikut peraturan yang ditetapkan kerajaan agar kawalan penyakit haiwan serta jaminan keselamatan makanan terpelihara di Malaysia," katanya.

Cubaan seludup daging, lima lembu lebih RM58,000

TUMPAT - Dua lelaki ditahan ketika sedang mengingati lima lembu dan daging beku bernilai lebih RM58,000 yang dipercayai untuk diseludup ke negara jiran di sekitar kawasan Pengkalan Haram Nibong, Pengkalan Kubor di sini pada Khamis.

Dalam serbuan jam 4.40 petang itu, dua kotak lima lembu bernilai RM1,280 dan 103 kotak daging beku bernilai RM57,680 dirampas anggota Batalion 7 Pasukan Gerakan Am (PGA) semasa membuat rondaan di kawasan berkenaan.

Gerakan Am (PGA7), Superintendent Azhari Nusi berkata, dua lelaki berusia 44 dan 55 tahun itu masing-masing dari Kampung Jejuluk Simpangan dan

Kampung Paloh Palekbang, Tumpat ditahan untuk siasatan lanjut. "Ketika serbuan tersebut, anggota kami sedang membuat rondaan

bermotosikal di sekitar Pengkalan Haram Nibong dan mendapati dua lelaki sedang mengangkat kotak dari sebuah lori dalam keadaan mencurigakan.

"Hasil pemeriksaan telah menjumpai beberapa kotak yang mengandungi barang berkenaan dan disyaki untuk diseludup ke negara jiran," katanya.

Sementara itu, dalam serbuan berasingan, seorang pemuda berusia 23 tahun ditahan di Taman Permai Gual Tinggi di Rantau Panjang bersama 588 pekete barangan sejuk beku bernilai RM10,962 pada jam 5.30 petang hari yang sama.

Breeders fear for their unfed animals

IPOH: A group of fish and livestock breeders in a Kuala Kangsar village who are under home quarantine are worried sick about their animals more than themselves.

Speaking on behalf of 11 breeders, Mohd Yusuf Jaafar, 57, said since villagers in Kampung Senggang were wearing pink and blue wristbands, none of them were allowed to step out of their houses, leaving their cattle, goats and chickens unfed since June 13.

"I am so worried because since we had to put on the wristbands on June 13, we do not know what is happening at our farms.

"Some of my friends who are rearing fish and prawns are in the same predicament," he said when contacted yesterday.

Mohd Yusuf said he was hoping that some form of arrangement could be made for them to attend to their animals.

"The cattle, goats and chickens, I am assuming, are in the shed, just eating whatever little grass or leftover grains there.

"For the fish and prawns, I have no idea how they are surviving. We, humans, are still getting provisions sent to us, but the animals are left without food," said Mohd Yusuf, adding that the farms were located

about 1km away. Mohd Yusuf had spoken to the authorities about their predicament but was told they were not allowed to leave their houses.

Out of desperation, he had contacted an animal activist, Dr Ranjit Kaur Mendhir, for advice.

When contacted, Dr Ranjit, a veterinarian, said there were cases of animal welfare neglect whenever the movement control order was announced in the country.

Feeders who go around providing food for stray dogs and cats found it difficult to leave their homes after 8pm, she said.

"There are many feeders who go out after 10pm.

"Some even go to specific locations to feed strays at 1am because these are the times stray animals come out," she said.

"I was also told that in Kampung Raja in Cameron Highlands, which is under enhanced MCO until June 27, feeders are finding it difficult to feed strays, as the authorities are watching them via drones.

"The authorities concerned must find ways to ensure animals are not left hungry during this pandemic when restriction orders are announced," added Dr Ranjit.

When contacted, Bukit Chandan assemblyman Maslin Sham Razman said he was aware of the issue and had forwarded the predicament of

the live-stock farmers to the district office.

He said the district officer had informed him about speaking to the village chief on getting volunteers to feed the animals.

"The district office is liaising with various agencies like the Fisheries and Veterinary Services departments to get the food required, and it will be handed over to the associations concerned," he said.
