Banyak kes jenayah haiwan tidak cukup bukti

SAUDARA PENGARANG,

BANYAK kes jenayah haiwan tidak boleh diteruskan di peringkat mahkamah kerana bukan sahaja tidak cukup bukti tapi tidak ada bukti kukuh dan jelas.

Apabila ditanya pengadu adakah mereka mempunyai bukti? Jawabnya, nenek kepada kawan sebelah mak dia yang beritahu.

Itu bukanlah bukti tapi itu maklumat ketiga yang boleh didengar namun tidak bermerit. Ramai juga yang tidak faham beza antara kezaliman dan pengabaian yang perlu diberikan notis penambahbaikan.

Ada pula pihak yang bergaduh dengan jiran menggunakan haiwan peliharaan jiran untuk mengenakan mereka dengan membuat laporan berbentuk sensasi dan mengada-adakan cerita bagi menggambarkan jiran itu zalim dan aniaya haiwan sebagai balas dendam.

Banyak faktor menyumbang kepada lambakan laporan kezaliman haiwan tetapi banyak yang tidak bermerit untuk bukan sahaja dibawa ke mahkamah. Malah peringkat menyiapkan kertas siasatan juga sukar dan jika dipersembahkan kepada pendakwa raya juga pasti tertolak.

Kerana itulah ramai menyangka pihak berkuasa sama ada Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar atau Jabatan Perhilitan Semenanjung Malaysia tidak membuat tindakan sekiranya terdapat laporan kes jenayah haiwan.

Jika berminat untuk mendapat pendedahan, orang ramai boleh mengikuti kursus yang dianjurkan oleh Persatuan Haiwan Malaysia bersama Akademi Haiwan Malaysia dan Malaysia Animal Crime Transparency (MyAct).

Antara sijil yang ditawarkan adalah Sijil Pengurusan Sistem Keadilan Jenayah Haiwan untuk orang awam, Sijil Tatacara Pengendalian Haiwan Terbiar untuk badan pengurusan bersama (JMB) dan Sijil Penguatkuasaan Undang-Undang dan Penyiasatan Jenayah Haiwan untuk pelajar-pelajar diploma atau ijazah sarjana muda bidang penguatkuasaan undang-undang dan penyiasatan.

Much-needed relief aid

RM50mil allocated for flood-affected agricultural sectors

KOTA BARU: A total of RM50mil from the Agricultural Disaster Fund has been allocated to compensate up to 50% of the losses incurred by farmers, breeders and fishermen affected by the floods, says Agriculture and Food Security Minister Datuk Seri Mohamad Sabu.

Based on the initial reports received, the agro-food sector in Kelantan had incurred an estimated total loss of over RM20mil involving 1,875 individuals, he said.

"The severely affected areas include Tumpat, Kota Baru, Pasir Mas, Bachok, Tanah Merah, Pasir Puteh, Machang, Jeli, Kuala Krai and Gua Musang," he told reporters after the Kelantan Sentuhan Agro Madan programme here yesterday that was also attended by Agrobank president and chief executive officer Datuk Tengku Ahmad Badli Shah Raja Hussin.

Mohamad presented food baskets to over 200 farmers, breeders and fishermen who were affected by the recent floods, Bernama reported.

Elaborating, he said the ministry's initiatives are crucial in helping flood-affected target groups to recover, contributing to the growth of the country's agriculture and agri-food sector.

He said food security is not solely under the responsibility of the ministry but involves the collective effort of all parties in line with the concept "Food Security Is a Shared Responsibility".

"To strengthen food security further, a total of RM400mil has been allocated in Budget 2024 to implement various initiatives with a focus on increasing domestic production and self-sufficiency in key food commodities.
