15 MINIT RM2,000
 ■ 19 kaki judi termasuk seorang wanita ditahan

Penampang

Masa perlawanan hanya 15 minit dengan pertaruhan mencecah RM2,000. Itulah peraturan diguna pakai kumpulan kaki judi ayam sabung yang diarahkan seminggu sekali di Kampung Kompimpinan Dabak, Jalan Putatan, kelmarin.

Gelanggang perlawanan yang diadakan di pekarangan rumah milik seorang wanita sejak tiga bulan lalu itu bagaimanapun berjaya dilekaskan polis dari Bahagian Siasatan Jenayah Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Penampang yang menyerbu rumah berkenaan.

Dalam serbuan jam 11.50 malam itu, ada di antara kaki judi cuba melarikan diri selepas menyedari kehadiran polis, namun ditangkap pantas tiga pegawai dan 20 anggota diketuai Ketua Bahagian Siasatan Jenayah IPD Penampang Asisten Superintendan Rajendran berjaya menahan 19 kaki judi termasuk seorang wanita.

Rajendran berkata, ketika serbuan, semua kaki judi sedang leka menyaksikan pertaruhan sabung ayam di luar rumah milik seorang wanita berusia 28 tahun.

"Kegiatan sabung ayam ini sudah berlaku sejak tiga bulan lalu. Polis percaya mereka mempunyai kumpulan WhatsApp bagi memaklumkan setiap pertaruhan yang akan dijalankan dan biasanya pada hujung minggu. Sekali pertaruhan sabung ayam 15 minit ada yang cecah RM2,000," katanya ketika ditemui, semalam.

Jelani berkata, polis turut merampas 38 ekor ayam dipercayai digunakan dalam perjudian sabung ayam.

"Ada di antara ayam sabung ini bernilai RM5,000, RM3,000 dan RM2,000 dan nilai sebenar rampasan ayam ini tidak dapat dipastikan. Polis turut merampas buku catitan pertaruhan, jam randik, 23 sangkar dawai, enam sangkar kayu dan wang tunai sebanyak RM3,156," katanya.

Menurutnya, semua yang ditahan berusia antara 26 dan 66 tahun. Ayam sabung yang dirampas dibawa ke IPD Penampang untuk siasatan lanjut.

"Operasi ini akan diteruskan dari semasa ke semasa dan kita sudah mengenal pasti beberapa lokasi kegiatan sabung ayam di daerah ini. Kes disiasat mengikut Seksyen 6(1) Akta Pertaruhan dan Seksyen 3(1) Penganiayaan Terhadap Bina-tang 1953," katanya.

At your service

Meet Zola, a service dog who helps out her human Katie Brigger at university.

IF you attempt to pet Zola the Labrador – and you will – prepare to be kindly but firmly rebuffed.

Katie Brigger said students, faculty and all other manner of pedestrian she and the pooch encounter on their jaunts across Penn State's campus are typically content to mind their own business ... 99.9% of the time, anyway.

"It can be hard for me to tell them not to (pet Zola)," Katie said.

Her dog's baleful brown eyes are far from Katie's biggest problem. As a toddler, she experienced a series of bilateral strokes and was diagnosed with a cerebrovascular disorder called moyamoya disease.

Katie, now 20 years old, has limited fine motor skills and uses a wheelchair to travel long distances.

Zola came into the picture last June, after Katie's application was given the stamp of approval from Susquehanna Service Dogs – and her roommates.

"My husband and I wanted to wait until she was old enough to take on the responsibility herself," Katie's mother, Heather Brigger, said.

The trade-off goes a little something like this: in return for closing locker doors, unzipping coats and pressing the handicap button at doorways, Katie provides Zola with a steady supply of treats and verbal affirmation.

Oh, and also nights off.

"She'll go get a squeaker toy and run around the whole house," Katie said.

When she's not unwinding with a rousing game of fetch, Zola is what in your office might pass for an enthusiastic go-getter.

On some mornings, Heather will catch the dog waiting patiently at Katie's feet, ready to start the day.

"She's very eager to work," Heather said. Travel is one of the perks of the job. Each week, Zola accompanies Katie to the classes that she's enrolled in at Penn State's University Park campus.

Both are participants in the LifeLink PSU programme, a partnership with the State College Area School District Department of Special Education that offers students the opportunity to experience college life before entering the workforce.

Zola is the district's first service dog to join the company.

"It's all we can do not to pet her," Yukelson said.

That, if you'll remember, is a big no-no when Zola is on the clock and it's up to Katie to lay down the law.

Yukelson thinks the added responsibility has helped Katie grow more confident and assertive, which will be a huge asset when she leaves school behind for good next spring.

"She needs to advocate not only for herself but for Zola," Yukelson said. —Tribune News Service
