PORK SMUGGLED INTO THAILAND

'Bones, blood of pigs contaminating Sungai Golok'

Smugglers lured by high pork prices

HIGH pork prices of up to RM100 per kilogramme in Thailand has led to pork being smuggled into the neighbouring country at the Kelantan border.

Most of the pigs are obtained from Pahang, Terengganu and Perak before being smuggled to Thailand using illegal bases around Kelantan. The pigs are cut into half before being transported to Thailand.

Investigations by the *New Straits Times* around nearby villages revealed that local folk were allowing their areas to be used as transit ports before the meat was sent to Thailand.

As soon as the meat arrives in Kelantan in four-wheel-drive vehicles or lorries, it is sent to a safe house in a nearby village.

When the coast is clear, the meat is transported using boats. State Malaysia Border Control Agency (Aksem) commander Mohd Asri Yahya said the illegal activity had been rampant since December.

He said the syndicate was active around Kampung Itik, and it operated at night to avoid the authorities.

"The smuggling of pigs has been around for a long time, but the activity has become rampant since December. Recently, we confiscated 81 pigs at Lalang Pepuyu believed to be from Pahang.

"We suspect the mastermind of the syndicate is based outside Kelantan and uses local folk around the border to assist him. Local villagers have expressed their fears on the potential contamination of river resources through this illegal activity."

Asri said the authorities would monitor the situation. This included working with the Wildlife and National Parks Department (Perhilitan) to overcome the issue.

Kelantan Perhilitan director Hasdi Hussain admitted that the smuggling was picking up pace. Hence, he said, Perhilitan would work with Aksem and other security agencies to curb these activities.

RANTAU PANJANG: The rampant smuggling of pork using the Sungai Golok route is raising concern among residents. They claim that the illegal activity is contaminating the river, as the bones of the pigs are frequently thrown into it. Previously, local residents would fish at Sungai Golok because there was ample supply, which allowed them to make a living. However, since this illegal activity, they could not do so because the pig bones and pig blood have contaminated the water. A villager in her 50s, who only wanted to be known as Esah, said this illegal activity had been going on for a long time and some people in the area were assisting the syndicate. "We don't care if they smuggle goats or cows, but because it involves pigs we can't eat anything from Sungai Golok," she said.

Rantau Panjang

Kegiatan penyeludupan khinzir yang semakin rancak menggunakan laluan Sungai Golok menimbulkan ke-bimbangan penduduk. Mereka mendakwa, kegiatan itu menyebabkan Sungai Golok yang menjadi tumpuan penduduk di kawasan berkenaan tercemar apabila tulang lebihan babi itu dibuang ke sungai. Jika sebelum ini, penduduk mencari etok dan ikan di Sungai Golok kerana bekalan yang banyak sehingga mampu menjana pendapatan, namun kegiatan tidak bertanggungjawab itu menyebabkan sungai berkenaan kotor dengan darah serta tulang babi. Penduduk kampung yang mahu dikenali sebagai Esah berusia 50-an berkata, aktiviti itu sudah lama berlaku dan dibantu penduduk yang beragama Buddha. "Kami tidak kisah sekiranya mereka menyeludup

kambing atau lembu. Ini membabitkan khinzir menyebabkan kami tidak boleh makan hasil dari Sungai Golok. "Setiap kali musim kemarau dan paras air Sungai Golok kering, memang jelas kelihatan tulang khinzir yang berselerak di lokasi berkenaan," katanya. Penduduk yang mahu dikenali sebagai Jusoh, 61, meminta pasukan keselamatan memperketatkan kawalan dan rondaan supaya kegiatan penyeludupan khinzir dihapuskan. "Sekiranya kegiatan itu tidak menjejaskan penduduk kampung, mungkin kami boleh berdiam diri. Namun berapa ramai yang makan hasil daripada Sungai Golok sedangkan ia dipenuhi tulang khinzir. "Kegiatan penyeludupan khinzir begitu aktif dan beberapa lokasi di Kampung Kuala Itik dijadikan sasaran untuk menghantar bekalan terbit," katanya.
