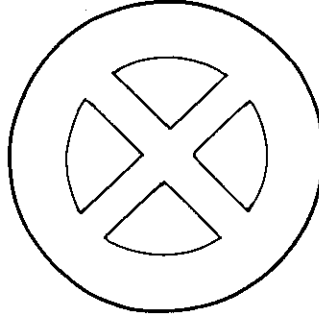
ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, 1958

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 73 of the Road Traffic Ordinance, 1958, the Minister of Transport hereby makes the following rules: 49 of 1958.

1. These rules may be cited as the **Traffic Signs (Size, Colour and Type) (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules, 1965.** Citation.

2. The Schedule to the Traffic Signs (Size, Colour and Type) Rules, 1959, is hereby amended by adding to Traffic sign No. 22 specified in Part II thereof the following new Traffic sign No. 22A: Amendment of Schedule, L.N. 167/59.

"22A. STOPPING TOTALLY PROHIBITED
Dimensions and Colour as in sign No. 22 above".

ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1953

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 5 and 86 of the Animals Ordinance, 1953, the Minister hereby makes the following rules: 17 of 1953.

1. These rules may be cited as the **Animals (In Transit) Rules, 1965.** Citation.

2. (1) In these Rules unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.
"animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and other ruminating animals and includes horses and swine;

"prohibited country" means any country or part of any country not specified in the Schedule to these Rules.

(2) The expressions "master", "officer of customs", "ship" and "veterinary authority" shall have the same meaning assigned to them in the Animals Ordinance, 1953.

3. When an animal is brought in any ship into a port in the States of Malaya in transit—

(a) from a port in a prohibited country, or

(b) from a port in a country which is not a prohibited country, but the ship since taking the animals on board has entered a port in any prohibited country,

Duties of Masters of vessels carrying animals from or via a prohibited country.

the master—

(i) shall not remove or cause to be removed such animal from such ship;

(ii) shall not land or cause to be landed the fittings, fodder, litter and other things used for any such animal or the dung of such animal;

(iii) shall not allow or permit any person other than a veterinary authority, an officer of customs, a Port Officer, and any person or persons actually engaged in tending the animals or cleansing the pens to enter any pen or other part of the ship in which such animal is kept, until the pen or other part of the ship has been cleansed and disinfected.

Persons leaving vessels to clean hands, etc.

4. Every person upon leaving that part of the ship in which such animal is or has recently been kept shall wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots with a disinfectant.

Pen, equipment and fittings to be cleansed at intervals.

5. The master shall whilst such ship is in port with such animal on board cause that part of the ship where such animal is kept including all equipment and fittings therein to be cleansed and disinfected at intervals not exceeding 24 hours.

MALAYSIA ACT

MODIFICATION OF LAWS (CUSTOMS) ORDER, 1964

APPOINTMENT OF FINANCIAL AUTHORITY

(Made under Article 4 (1))

L.N. 306/64.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4 (1) of the Modification of Laws (Customs) Order, 1964, I, Tan Siew Sin, Federal Minister of Finance, hereby appoint, with effect from 15th April, 1965, the State Minister for Finance, Singapore, to be a financial authority to exercise in Singapore the functions of the Federal Minister under the sub-sections of section 124 of the Customs Ordinance, 1960, as specified in the Schedule hereto.

2. The exercise by the financial authority of the functions referred to in the foregoing paragraph shall be subject to any written directions which the Federal Minister may from time to time issue and in respect of sub-section (xiv) the financial authority, in exercising the powers, shall maintain uniformity in practice with the States of Malaya.
