LIMBANG, 7 Okt: Timbalan Menteri Industri Makanan, Komoditi dan Pembangunan Wilayah Sarawak (MFICORD), Datuk Dr Abdul Rahman Ismail mengetuai delegasi ke Australia bagi mengenalpasti ladang ternakan membekalkan kerbau tenusu dan lembu pedaging untuk Sarawak.

Beliau berkata, lawatan selama lima hari bermula semalam hingga Jumaat ini sejajar hasrat Sarawak untuk meningkatkan bekalan kerbau dan lembu dan keterjaminan makanan

negeri.

“Kementerian Pertanian dan Keterjaminan Makanan (KPKM) memperuntuk RM23 juta merangkumi RM15 juta bagi lembu dan RM8 juta bagi kerbau dibawah Peruntukan Meningkatkan Keterjaminan Makanan 2025.

“Di bawah peruntukan itu, kita mengenalpasti ladang ternakan di Australia untuk membekalkan kerbau tenusu dan lembu pedaging untuk Sarawak,” katanya dalam kenyataan.

Delegasi mengadakan lawatan ke Ladang Carmor Plains di Darwin milik Syarikat Rosewood, anak syarikat Perbadanan Pembangunan Ekonomi Sarawak (SEDC) Sarawak yang membekalkan sejumlah 1,500 ekor lembu jenis Brahman.

Katanya, Carmor Plains seluas 100 hektar ini adalah stesen pengemokan lembu dan boleh memuatkan sehingga 12 ribu ekor satu-satu masa untuk di eksport terutamanya ke Asia Tenggara.

Hadir sama ialah Pengarah Kawasan Pembangunan Pertanian Bersepadu (IADA) Batang Lupar yang juga mewakili KPKM, Irene Loh, Pegawai Tadbir MFICORD, Baijury Dzulhizam Spawi, Pegawai Veterinar, Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar Negeri Sarawak (JPVNS), Dr Siong Jing Jing dan delegasi lain. -TVS

Peka Files Report on UPM Dog Killings

She said the group also
submitted evidence that a
staff member from the
university's occupational
safety and health
management (OSHM) office
signed and reviewed the
documents of the
contractor's two operations.

Peka vice-president Dr
Kartini Farah Rahim said the
report was lodged against
UPM, the veterinary services
department (DVS), and the
third-party contractor
allegedly hired by the
university to carry out the
killings.

"We also have evidence that
the director of UPM's OSHM
office gave instructions
during a meeting for the
dogs to be captured and
disposed of by shooting," she
told a press conference
outside the Petaling Jaya
police headquarters.

Peka president Rajesh Nagarajan told reporters he was shocked that UPM had yet to lodge a police report on the matter.

“There is no longer any dispute, it is clear that the shooting took place at the UPM campus. What are they waiting for?” he said.

He also questioned the DVS’s silence, noting that it had not issued any statement on its Facebook page or website regarding the incident, and urged the department to bring the perpetrators to justice.

Rajesh gave the university until this Friday to take action against the perpetrators, failing which he said a protest would be held at the university’s main gate next week.

Last week, FMT reported Peka as claiming that the university had killed 18 dogs and five puppies on its campus in two operations in late 2024 and early 2025.

Kartini claimed that the university had outsourced the operations to a third-party contractor, citing an alleged invoice between the company and the university for the culling of between 20 and 30 stray dogs.

Rajesh today said he had

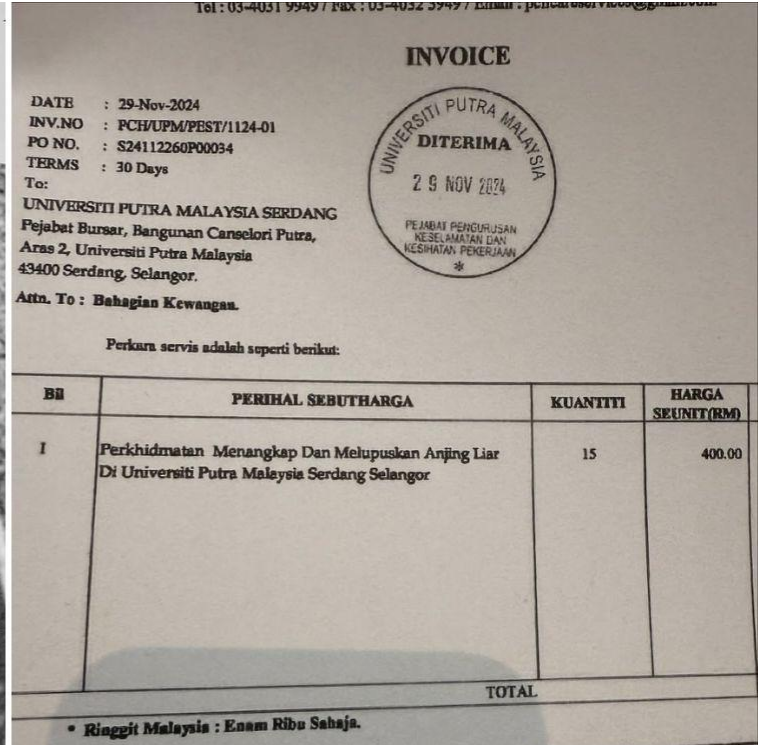
contacted the contractor involved and was told that the rate was RM220 per dog killed, while UPM was allegedly charged RM400.

“That’s quite a generous discount, isn’t it? So where did the extra RM180 go? Both the contractor and UPM must answer these questions,” he said.

UPM said on Friday that it had formed a committee to investigate Peka’s claim, adding that it took feedback on its stray management seriously.-[MSN](#)

University Accused of Paying to Have Stray Dogs on Campus Killed

A non-government organisation (NGO) in Malaysia has accused a university in Seri Kembangan, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), of paying to have the stray dogs on its campus killed.

In a press conference on Sunday (5 Oct), Pertubuhan Pelindung Khazanah Alam's (PEKA) president and deputy president alleged that the cullings were conducted in December 2024 and January 2025.

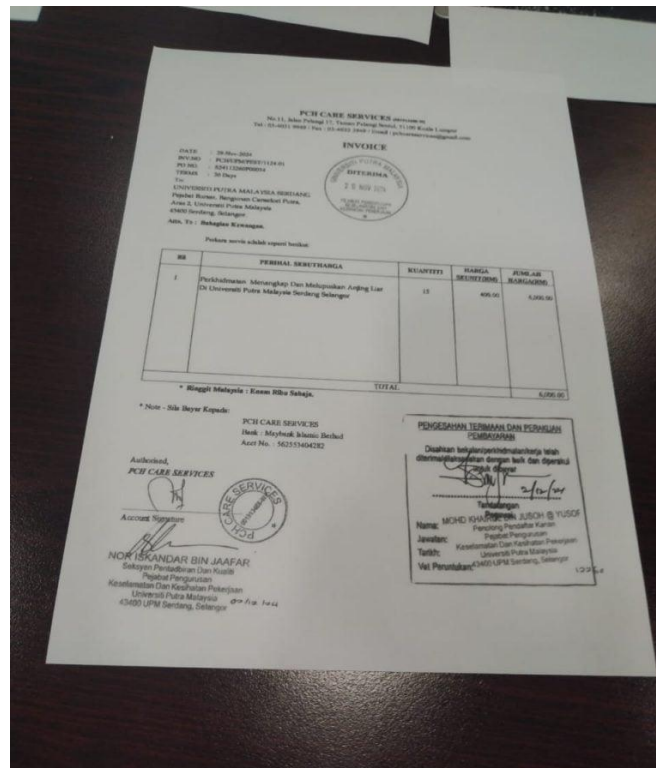
The dogs were allegedly poisoned and shot dead.

"A total of 15 dogs were killed in the first ops and three more in the second," deputy president Dr Kartini Farah Rahim said.

UPM's Occupational Safety and Health Administration Office allegedly contracted a private company, PCH Care Services, to perform the killings.

The organisation also presented an invoice from the private company stating that the university ordered the "capture and removal" of The invoice was dated 29 Nov 2024.

15 dogs at a rate of RM400 (S\$120) per animal.

NGO calls on authorities to investigate university

In an earlier statement published on 29 Sept, PEKA said there was photographic evidence that the company killed at least 15 dogs through shooting.

Through these actions, PEKA believes both UPM and PCH Care Services violated Section 29 of the Animal Welfare Act 2015, which prohibits inflicting unnecessary pain, suffering, or death to animals.

Furthermore, if the firearms used in the alleged shooting do not have proper licences, they may have also offended the Arms Act 1960 and/or the Firearms (Increased Penalties) Act 1971.-[MSNEWS](#)

Peka Threatens Protest if UPM Dog Shooting Incident Not Investigated

PETALING JAYA: A group of activists from the Association for the Protection of the Natural Heritage of Malaysia (Peka) has threatened to stage a major protest if the incident involving the shooting of dogs at Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) is not investigated.

At around noon on Tuesday (Oct 7), Peka vice president Dr Kartini Farah Rahim, through her lawyer Rajesh Nagarajan lodged a police report at the Petaling Jaya police headquarters, calling for investigations into UPM, the Veterinary Services Department and PCH Services, the company allegedly responsible for shooting the dogs.

"The Animal Welfare Act strictly prohibits the shooting of dogs without special permission.

"In particular, Section 30 forbids the use of firearms to kill animals," said Dr Kartini.

"We have evidence showing that the Director of the OSHA Office at UPM instructed

during a meeting that the dogs be caught and disposed of by shooting.

"We urge the police to conduct a thorough investigation into this matter," she added.

Rajesh further demanded that UPM's Vice-Chancellor and the Veterinary Services Department take immediate action.-[THE STAR](#)

KUALA TERENGGANU – Golongan penternak di Terengganu berharap Belanjawan 2026 memberi tumpuan terhadap peningkatan kos makanan ternakan, keperluan infrastruktur dan isu kelulusan merancang yang dilihat semakin membebankan pengusaha kecil dan sederhana.

meningkat akibat harga makanan ternakan, elektrik, ubat-ubatan dan vaksin yang semakin tinggi.

“Harga makanan ayam sama ada dalam bentuk dedak mentah atau palet siap proses semakin mahal.

“Jadi kami mohon agar kerajaan dapat teruskan dan

Kerajaan juga diharapkan dapat memperkenalkan subsidi bersasar, skim geran padanan serta bantuan teknologi bagi memperkukuh daya saing industri ternakan ayam, kambing dan lembu yang menjadi antara penyumbang utama sekuriti makanan negara.

Pengurus Ladang Ayam Ajil, Mohd Zul Fahmi Long, 35, berkata, kos pengeluaran bagi penternak ayam kini

tambah baik subsidi makanan ternakan atau beri insentif khusus supaya kos boleh dikawal.

“Ini penting bagi memastikan harga ayam dan telur di pasaran kekal stabil dan mampu milik,” katanya ketika ditemui di ladang ternakan di Ajil, Hulu Terengganu.

Menurutnya, selain subsidi, kerajaan juga perlu memperkukuh kemudahan

infrastruktur di kawasan luar bandar seperti jalan ladang, bekalan elektrik stabil dan sumber air bersih bagi membantu mengurangkan kos operasi penternak.

Katanya lagi, isu kelulusan merancang untuk reban turut menjadi beban besar apabila penternak terpaksa menanggung pelbagai caj

Justeru, beliau berharap kerajaan meneliti semula struktur harga makanan ternakan supaya lebih mampu milik serta menyalurkan bantuan subsidi kecil kepada penternak kampung.

“Saya usahakan sendiri menternak 22 ekor kambing sejak lima tahun lepas. Untuk

termasuk fi perunding dan deposit perobohan walaupun reban sedia ada telah lama digunakan.

Sementara itu, penternak kambing kecil-kecilan, Mazlan Malik, 62, pula berkata, peningkatan harga makanan ternakan turut memberi kesan kepada penternak kampung yang menjalankan operasi secara bersendirian.

makanan sahaja terutama dedak, kos perbelanjaan kira-kira RM20 sehari dan sebulan dalam RM600.

“Tetapi permintaan bukan selalu ada, sedangkan harga jualan kambing masih sekitar RM700 seekor di sini.

“Saya juga perlu mencari rumput tambahan untuk menampung harga dedak yang semakin meningkat,” katanya.

Penternak lembu dari Kampung Durian Burung, Muhammad Allif Ismail, 32, berkata, harga makanan tambahan lembu seperti dedak dan palet kini melonjak tinggi.

“Sekarang harga dedak lembu dan palet makanan tambahan sekitar RM60 hingga RM75 bagi setiap 50 kilogram.

“Dulu masa tahun 2020, harga paling murah RM46 saja untuk kuantiti sama,” katanya yang menternak lembu sejak 2018.

Menurutnya, peningkatan kos ini menyebabkan margin keuntungan penternak semakin kecil dan boleh menjejaskan pengeluaran daging tempatan jika tidak segera ditangani.

“Kami harap Belanjawan 2026 ada peruntukan khas untuk bantu penternak kecil sama ada dalam bentuk subsidi makanan, bantuan ubah suai kandang atau geran kecil untuk tambah ternakan,” katanya.-[SINARHARIAN](#)

Tertekan makanan sering dihurung lalat

KOTA TINGGI – Penduduk Kampung Sayang di sini hidup dalam keadaan tertekan ekoran masalah lalat yang semakin serius didakwa berpunca daripada perusahaan reban ayam yang terletak berhampiran kediaman mereka.

Seorang penduduk, Nizam Wahab, 53, berkata, ia semakin serius sejak dua bulan lalu apabila jumlah lalat bertambah banyak setiap hari terutama ketika hujan dan waktu malam.

Katanya, bukan sahaja masalah lalat, malah penduduk juga terpaksa berdepan masalah bau busuk dedak dan najis ayam setiap malam.

“Kami makan sekali sahaja

sehari itu pun pada waktu malam menggunakan cahaya pelita atau lilin. Nak makan pun tak selesa baru buka makanan, lalat terus hurung.

“Pada waktu malam jika buka lampu lalat datang menghurung kerana tertarik pada cahaya. Tidur tidak nyenyak kerana menahan bau busuk,” katanya di sini semalam.

Seorang lagi penduduk, Noraisma Alias, 40, berkata, masalah itu membuatkan anak-anaknya tidak fokus belajar di rumah.

Katanya, lebih teruk anak-anaknya pernah mengalami cirit birit akibat kehadiran lalat yang terlalu banyak di rumah.
