Lebih 40 Ekor Kucing Mati ditemui di Apartmen Subang Jaya, Berpuluh-puluh Lagi Kurus Kering

Pihak berkuasa menemui 41 ekor kucing mati dan menyelamatkan 36 ekor kucing yang terabai teruk dari sebuah apartmen di Subang Jaya, sekali gus mendorong siasatan di bawah Akta Kebajikan Haiwan 2015.

Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar (DVS) Selangor telah menjalankan serbuan ke atas unit tersebut pada 13 Mac kira-kira jam 4 petang selepas menerima aduan awam tentang bau busuk, lapor Kosmo!.

Menurut pengarah DVS Selangor, Dr Hassuzana Khalil, 31 bangkai kucing ditemui dibalut dengan plastik di dalam peti sejuk beku.

Sepuluh bangkai lain ditemui di ruang tamu dan di dalam sangkar.

36 ekor kucing yang masih hidup, yang terdiri daripada pelbagai baka dan umur, didapati kurang berat badan dan dalam keadaan lemah.

“Mereka dipercayai telah

diabaikan dan tidak dijaga dengan betul sebelum serbuan,” kata Dr Hassuzana.

Unit itu diduduki oleh seorang wanita berusia 49 tahun, yang menurut pihak berkuasa telah memelihara kucing-kucing tersebut selama kira-kira setahun. Motif tindakannya kini sedang disiasat.-

On 13 March, Selangor Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) officers discovered 41 dead cats in a Subang Jaya apartment unit around 4pm after receiving public complaints about a foul stench emanating from the unit.

31 carcasses were wrapped in plastic in a freezer, while 10 more were scattered in the living room and cages.

The officers managed to save 36 other cats of various ages, genders, and breeds. The cats

were found alive in cages but are severely emaciated and in a weak condition. Initial checks found that the cats were severely dehydrated and suffering from various illnesses due to the filthy and messy environment in which they live.

DVS Selangor director Dr Hassuzana Khalil said the carcasses were sent to the veterinary laboratory in Salak Tinggi for post-mortem.

Meanwhile, the rescued cats are placed in a veterinary

clinic and temporary shelters to undergo intensive treatment and recovery.

Investigations revealed that the apartment was occupied by a 49-year-old woman who had kept the cats for about a year.

The authorities are still trying to ascertain a motive, and the case is being investigated under the Animal Welfare Act 2015.

Upon conviction, the suspect faces a fine of up to RM100,000, up to three years imprisonment, or both.-

41 Cat Carcasses Found In Apartment, 36 More In Critical Condition

RESIDENTS of an apartment in Subang Jaya were shocked to discover 41 decomposing cat carcasses in a woman's home.

Even more heartbreaking, 31 of the carcasses were found wrapped in plastic and stored in a freezer, while another 10 carcasses were found littering the living room and cages.

All the unfortunate cats are believed to have died due to not being given enough food, while 36 others were found

still alive in their cages.

According to reports in Kosmo!, they were severely dehydrated, with emaciated bodies and suffering from various infections due to an environment contaminated with faecal waste.

It is understood that the unit used as an unofficial animal shelter was very dirty and unkempt, while animal carcasses were found lying in cages and on the floor without any food or water.

A spokesperson for the animal rescue group said the scene inside the residential unit was heartbreaking, with most of the surviving cats in a state of trauma and too weak to move.

It is understood that the unit was rented by an individual on the pretext of saving stray animals, but the situation got out of control, leading to the death of the animals involved.

The case is currently being investigated by the Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) and the police under the Animal Welfare Act 2015.

If convicted, the perpetrators could face a hefty fine or imprisonment, or both, for animal cruelty and neglect.

All the surviving cats are now being placed in veterinary clinics and temporary shelters to undergo intensive care and rehabilitation. –

MALAYSIA: Dozens of dead and severely neglected cats have been discovered in an apartment in Subang Jaya, prompting an investigation by Malaysian authorities under animal welfare laws.

Authorities found 41 dead cats and rescued 36 surviving animals during a raid conducted on 13 March at approximately 4pm.

The operation followed public complaints about a foul smell emanating from the unit.

According to Kosmo!, the

Selangor Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) carried out the raid after receiving multiple reports from residents.

Carcasses found in freezer and living areas

Selangor DVS director Hassuzana Khalil said that 31 of the dead cats were discovered wrapped in plastic and stored inside a freezer.

Ten additional carcasses were found in the living room and inside cages within the apartment, indicating that

the animals had been kept in confined and unsuitable conditions.

The authorities have sent the carcasses for post-mortem examinations to determine the cause of death.

Surviving cats in poor condition

The 36 surviving cats, comprising various breeds and ages, were found to be underweight and in a weakened state.

Dr Hassuzana, describing the animals' condition at the time of rescue, "They are believed to have been neglected and not properly cared for before the raid."

Investigation under animal welfare law

Authorities said the apartment was occupied by a 49-year-old woman who had reportedly been keeping the cats for about a year.

The motive behind the alleged neglect remains under investigation.

According to officials, investigation papers are being prepared for submission to the deputy public prosecutor's office.

If convicted under the Animal Welfare Act 2015, the individual could face a fine of up to RM100,000

(approximately US\$21,000), a prison sentence of up to three years, or both.-

KUALA LUMPUR, April 9 — Authorities discovered 41 dead cats and rescued 36 severely neglected cats from an apartment in Subang Jaya, prompting an investigation under the Animal Welfare Act 2015.

The Selangor Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) conducted a raid on the unit on March 13 at approximately 4pm after receiving public complaints about a foul smell, Kosmo! Reported.

According to DVS Selangor

director Dr Hassuzana Khalil, 31 of the carcasses were found wrapped in plastic inside a freezer.

Ten other carcasses were located in the living room and in cages.

The 36 surviving cats, comprising various breeds and ages, were all found to be underweight and in a weak condition.

“They are believed to have been neglected and not properly cared for before the raid,” Dr Hassuzana said.

The unit was occupied by a 49-year-old woman, who authorities say had been keeping the cats for about a year. The motive for her actions is currently under investigation.

Dr Hassuzana confirmed that the carcasses have been sent for post-mortem analysis and that investigation papers are being prepared for submission to the deputy public prosecutor's office.

If convicted under the Animal Welfare Act 2015, the suspect faces a fine of up to RM100,000, a prison sentence of up to three years, or both.-

The Selangor Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) revealed that forty-one cats were found dead in a squalid Subang Jaya apartment, while 36 others were alive but severely debilitated in cages.

Public complaints of a foul smell led Selangor Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) officers to raid the unit at around 4pm on March 13.

Thirty-one carcasses were found wrapped in plastic in a freezer, while 10 more were scattered in the living room and cages, Kosmo reported.

The squalid apartment, occupied by a 49-year-old woman, contained decomposed cat carcasses emitting a strong stench.

A further 36 cats were found alive in cages, but in a severely emaciated and weak condition, it reported

DVS Selangor director Dr Hassuzana Khalil said the situation posed serious health risks.

The carcasses have been sent to the veterinary laboratory in Salak Tinggi for post-mortem, she said.

She said the cats found alive were of various ages, genders and breeds, but all were severely underweight and weak.

"They are believed to have been neglected and not properly cared for before the raid," she said.

Investigations found the suspect had kept the cats for about a year, and authorities are looking into the motive behind the case.

Investigation papers are being finalised before submission to the deputy public prosecutor for further action.

The case is being investigated under the Animal Welfare Act 2015.

If convicted, the suspect faces a fine of up to RM100,000, up to three years in prison, or both.-[NST](#)

SUBANG JAYA: Kertas siasatan berhubung penemuan 41 bangkai kucing di sebuah rumah di sini, oleh Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar (DVS) Selangor, telah lengkap dan akan dirujuk kepada Timbalan Pendakwa Raya (TPR) untuk tindakan lanjut dalam masa terdekat.

Pengarahnya, Dr Hassuzana Khalil berkata, hasil siasatan mendapati, wujud kesalahan pengabaian terhadap kucing berkenaan.

“Jabatan mendapati wujud kesalahan di bawah Akta Kebajikan Haiwan 2015 khususnya di bawah seksyen 29(1).

“Siasatan telah lengkap dan kertas siasatan akan dirujuk kepada Pejabat Timbalan Pendakwa Raya dalam masa terdekat,” jelasnya.

Tambahnya, DVS Selangor juga akan mendapatkan perintah mahkamah untuk membenarkan kesemua 36 kucing yang diselamatkan

untuk diserahkan kepada orang awam sebagai haiwan angkat.

“Sebanyak 36 ekor kucing yang masih hidup telah dihantar ke tempat simpanan haiwan Pejabat Veterinar Daerah Petaling, bagi pemeriksaan dan rawatan selanjutnya,” katanya ketika dihubungi Buletin TV3.

Terdahulu, media melaporkan penemuan 41 bangkai kucing di sebuah rumah pangsapuri di sini, pada Mac lalu oleh pihak berkuasa setelah mendapat laporan orang awam.

Pemeriksaan dalam unit kediaman yang diduduki seorang wanita tempatan itu mendapati, banyak sangkar haiwan serta alat pembawa haiwan disusun dan bertindih antara satu sama lain.

Turut ditemui, 10 bangkai kucing di dalam dan luar sangkar, manakala 31 bangkai lagi ditemui dalam peti sejuk beku.
